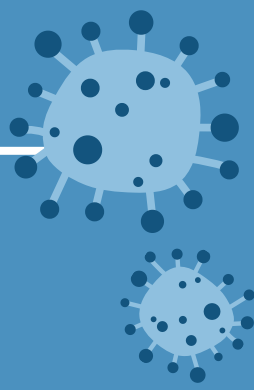

How do I know if I have MRSA?

MRSA can only be diagnosed by a test called 'microbiological culture'. These cultures will be collected if you belong to a risk group. If you answer yes to one or more of the following questions, it means that you belong to a risk group and should, therefore, perform a screening test.
